

HOW TO INTRODUCE YOUR NEW CAT TO YOUR HOME



- It's exciting to have a new cat, but don't crowd them! It takes time for animals to adjust to a new environment.

Don't have visitors for a couple of days to let your new cat adjust

- Cats can be nervous coming into new environments.
- Introduce them to a small room first with their litter box to get them acquainted with it.

Smaller rooms keeps cats from being overwhelmed in their new home

- After adjusting to the small room for a few days, gradually let them explore the rest of your house.

- Let them come to you.

Don't pick up the cat if they aren't ready. Extend your hand and let them smell it. If they want pet, they'll rub against your hand.

- If you have children, it is important to teach them how to safely and gently handle your new feline companion.

Children can learn responsible pet care by observing your behavior

- It can take several weeks for cats to feel comfortable.

Cats occasionally have temporary behavior issues when adjusting

- Provide your new cat with places to climb and scratch.

Cats like to be up high to feel safe

- Cats like sleeping in soft, warm spots.

consider having a bed for them or they may take yours!
