



MEDICAL CARE PETS RECEIVE AT THE SHELTER

Our Licensed Veterinary Technician examines all animals that come into the Shelter. If any issues are identified or showing symptoms, our LVT consults with the veterinarians, and the pet receives treatment.

- **All cats that are 6 months or older are given an FIV/FELV test.**
- **All cats and kittens are given age appropriate preventative or treatment. Some treatments require monthly follow up by the owner after adoption.**
- **Dogs receive a an age appropriate broad spectrum dewormer and flea treatment as needed.**
- **Every animal is spayed or neutered, fully vaccinated (age appropriate, some require later boosters that the adopter is responsible for) and a microchip.**
- **Treatment & vetting need follow up post adoption. After adoptions, these treatments and medical care are at the expense of the owner.**

The majority of pets that come into KAAS come with no medical background information. Pets receive an initial exam from our LVT for any lumps, dental issues, eye problems, lameness, and any warranted diagnostics based on issues seen. Animals are carefully observed by staff during the course of daily care to identify any issues.

All adopters read, are explained, and sign an agreement stating that they are responsible for all care, and the resulting cost, once they leave the Shelter.

Being a non-profit, KAAS has limited funds and resources, which is why your donations make such an impact. We are not a veterinary clinic, nor do we have full-time veterinarians on staff, but we provide the animals with the best possible care when they are in our facility. KAAS staff would not send a pet home if they are visibly showing signs of a medical issue while in our care.
